When it is not going well, it is really hard work to bring up any topic without its leading to bigger issues that may or may not be resolved. When a conflict has occurred, what methods do we use to make amends and restore trust?

Compassionate Communication, a method and philosophy of using language in a nonviolent and restorative manner is based on the work of Marshall Rosenberg, the author of *Nonviolent Communication, A Language of Life*. This method is versatile and is compatible with and complementary to building community in many workplaces, families, friendships, and casual relationships. In this workshop, we will explain some basic definitions, ideas, and practices that we can implement with our inner work and within our teams.
